


Day 1: Thursday, February 15, 2018 Overnight Flight

Day 2: Friday, February 16, 2018 Santiago, Chile - Tour Begins Welcome to Santiago de Chile. Take in the views of this metropolitan hub tucked inside the Andes Mountains, and witness the vibrancy of one of South America's most modern cities. Tonight, meet your fellow travelers over sumptuous food and wine in the stunning colonial neighborhood known as Barrio Lastarria. (D)

Day 3: Saturday, February 17, 2018 Santiago This morning, embark on a city tour showcasing La Moneda Presidential Palace and the Paseo Ahumada pedestrian avenue. Ride the funicular up Cerro San Cristobal for sweeping views of Santiago and the Andes, and admire the Statue of the Immaculate Conception. Delve into Chile's checkered past under the 20th-century dictatorship of General Augusto Pinochet at the Museum of Memory and Human Rights. Then, head over to a bustling central market to mingle with the locals. The evening is yours to explore this wonderful city on your own. Or you may choose to take the optional "Experience Santiago" tour to enjoy a tasting at a winery, followed by a visit to the famous poet and activist Pablo Neruda's Santiago home; cap it off with an incredible roasted lamb dinner and Chilean folk music show. (B)

Day 4: Sunday, February 18, 2018 Santiago - Buenos Aires, Argentina Fly to Buenos Aires, birthplace of the tango. Stretching along the banks of the Rio de la Plata, the "Paris of South America" is a mosaic of European-styled architecture and South American spirit. After being greeted by your local guide, head to the Feria de San Telmo, the famous Sunday market in one of Buenos Aires' most historic neighborhoods. Meander through street after street of antiques; stop into little shops and view the local works of art, the handcrafted treasures, authentic leather products and more; or sit back with an empanada and yerba mate tea and take in the street performers and musicians. Then, enjoy a drink at your beautiful hotel in the heart of the chic Recoleta neighborhood. Tonight, head to the Esquina Carlos Gardel Tango House, named after Argentina's most famous tango maestro, where you'll savor Argentine cuisine and wine before a **stunning tango performance.** (B, D)


Day 5: Monday, February 19, 2018 Buenos Aires Today the choice is yours! Perhaps you'll choose to experience the lively capital by bus. Or, for the more adventurous, you may prefer to take in the city on an exhilarating bicycle tour with a local guide. Both options bring you to the Teatro Colon opera house; the Avenida 9 de Julio; the Metropolitan Cathedral, the former church of Pope Francis I; Recoleta Cemetery, where Evita Peron rests; the Presidential Palace, the Casa Rosada at Plaza de Mayo; and the colorful neighborhood of La Boca. The rest of the day is yours to create your own adventure. Maybe you'll stroll through San Martin Park or Calle de Florida, a shopper's paradise; or possibly you'll take the optional Tigre Delta trip where you'll pass by an array of historic mansions and former residences of Buenos Aires' aristocracy before boarding a cruise through canals meandering past a network of homes that sit on stilts. (B)

Day 6: Tuesday, February 20, 2018 Buenos Aires - San Antonio de Areco - Buenos Aires This morning, cross the Argentine Pampas to experience the heart and culture of Argentina's version of the "wild west." Embark on a guided tour of the charming country village of San Antonio de Areco, the birthplace of gaucho traditions. Visit with some of the local artisans and silversmiths before heading to a typical estancia where **you'll dine on a hearty** asado lunch – a traditional Argentine barbecue – and take your seat at a horse whispering show performed by authentic gauchos. You'll get the chance to relax on the estancia grounds before heading back to Buenos Aires for a free evening. (B, L)

Day 7: Wednesday, February 21, 2018 Buenos Aires - Iguazu Falls, Brazil Fly to Iguazu Falls – located at the crossroads of Brazil,

Argentina and Paraguay – hailed as the most beautiful waterfalls in the world, and one of the Seven Natural Wonders of the World. **Board the Rainforest Ecological Train** inside the national park on the Argentine side and walk to the platform overlooking powerful Devil's Throat. Discover unparalleled views of five waterfalls as they plummet into the Iguazu River. Then cross into the Brazil side and check into your resort. Cap off your day with a relaxing dinner. (B, D)

Day 8: Thursday, February 22, 2018 Iguazu Falls Soak up the breathtaking views of the waterfalls from the Brazilian side. Join your local guide as you discover how Brazil and Argentina have both fought to protect the beauty and raw power of the falls by making each side a national park. You will see first-hand why Eleanor Roosevelt, upon seeing Iguazu Falls, exclaimed "Poor Niagara." This afternoon you may choose an optional jungle boat ride at the base of the falls, or just relax and enjoy the many amenities at your resort. (B)

Day 9: Friday, February 23, 2018 Iguazu Falls - Rio de Janiero Fly to Rio de Janeiro. Magnificent views, beautiful beaches, flamboyant Carnival costumes, great cuisine and friendly people make Rio the cultural capital of Brazil. Witness the city of Rio that captivated the world during the 2016 Summer Olympics. Stop by the Maracanã football stadium, which hosted the 2014 World Cup finals, before continuing on to the famous Carnival parade route, the Sambadrome. Afterward, behold the renowned Metropolitan Cathedral whose architecture was inspired by a Mayan pyramid. Check into your beachfront hotel in the exclusive Leblon neighborhood. Learn how to

craft *caipirinhas* – Brazil's famous cocktail made with sugar cane liquor and lime – before **venturing to the top of Sugarloaf Mountain** this evening. Then, cap the night off at Rio Scenarium, a lavishly decorated restaurant and music venue in the historic Lapa district. Meet local *Cariocas*, the name for people from Rio de Janiero, for dinner, music, and dancing that celebrates the rich history and vibrancy of the Brazilian people. (B, D)

Day 10: Saturday, February 24, 2018 Rio de Janiero Journey to Corcovado by train to see Christ the Redeemer, one of the largest Art Deco statues in the world. Take in the panoramic vistas of Tijuca Forest National Park. With 360-degree views around the city, you'll soon realize why this statue is one of the new Seven Wonders of the World. Then spend time engaging with locals at the one of the city's open-air markets. Break into small groups with local market guides as you discover and taste over a dozen different types of exotic fruits from Brazil. This afternoon, you choose your activity! Perhaps you'll choose a behind-the-scenes look at Carnival and meet the artists who are designing the floats, costumes and dances during their year-round preparations for Rio's biggest event. Or, maybe you'd prefer to join a local guide for a tour of a favela; learn about the unique contrasts and paradoxes of Brazilian society as you stroll through the community center, a school, and a local home; relish some time for coffee, cake and discussion with residents. The evening is free for your own exploration. (B)

Day 11: Sunday, February 25, 2018 Rio de Janiero Your day is at leisure to explore fabulous Rio de Janiero on your own. Relax by the

beach at your resort or take a shuttle to Copacabana. Or, perhaps you'll take an optional tour and board a jeep for a ride through the Tijuca forest followed by a visit to historic Santa Teresa. Or maybe an optional cooking class is more to your liking — you'll immerse yourself in local flavors as you join a local chef in a cooking class where you'll learn how to cook like a true Carioca! Tonight, join your fellow travelers for a farewell feast in a typical Brazilian *churrascaria*. Indulge in wine and meats slow-roasted to perfection. (B. D)

Day 12: Monday, February 26, 2018 Rio de Janiero - Tour Ends Transfer to the airport for your flight home. For those with later flights, you can choose an optional visit to the Olympic Park and the famous Botanical Gardens. (B)

PLEASE NOTE:

Book Now rates valid until Aug 16, 2017, valid on air inclusive packages only. Passport and Visa for Brazil (approximate visa cost is 160 USD) are required for this tour at your expense. This tour may require a certificate of Yellow Fever inoculation when applying for your Brazilian visa especially if you have travelled to Peru prior to Brazil. These fees are at your own expense. Rates are approximate and can be changed at any time based on governing authority.

The Argentine National Immigration Directorate (DNM) has launched a new online system to process payment of their reciprocity fee. Travelers must now pay this fee through the Provincia Pagos payment system prior to their arrival into Argentina. US and Canadian citizens must pay the reciprocity by accessing the following website: www.migraciones.gov.ar/vsrvbapro.php. This fee is approx. 160 USD for US citizens, valid for the life of the passport and 92 USD for Canadian citizens, single entry, and is subject to change at the discretion of the Argentinean government. Fee does not apply to UK citizens. Please contact your consulate for further details. This fee is at your own expense and again, must be paid by credit card online prior to arrival.

Due to flight schedules, a pre/post night may be required in some gateway cities (at an additional cost). Please inquire at time of reservation.

The days and order of sightseeing may change to best utilize your time on tour. Single accommodations are limited and are available on a first come, first served basis.

Triple accommodations are not available on this tour.

To complete your tour, we <u>include</u> roundtrip airport-to-hotel transfers when purchasing our airfare with your tour. Tigre y Delta Boat Tour

Just 18 miles outside of Buenos Aires, discover the extraordinary ecological zone of the Parana River delta. Enjoy a tour with a local guide on this breathtaking journey. Behold a picturesque coastline dotted with marinas, stunning homes and riverside dwellings. Upon arrival in San Isidro, take a short trip up the Tigre. A private river excursion by boat explores the streams and canals of this river delta. Each year, 90 million tons of sediment carried by the river creates thousands of islands and islets crisscrossed by rivers and brooks. The natural beauty of the Tigre will amaze you as you travel down its web of interconnecting waterways. Then head to the Puerto de Frutos, where the banks of the Tigre River are transformed into an open-air market. The streets come alive with activity and color. Have time to explore the market with vendors selling fresh flowers, fruit and delicious jams and honey, while others sell beautiful handmade crafts including rustic fabrics and furniture, and accessories made in cane and willow. Join us on this day in the countryside getting to know the natural beauty and the market culture in Argentina. *Duration: Approximately 5 hours.* Please note a minimum of 2 passengers is required. Iguazu Falls Jungle & Boat Ride (Brazil Side)

Venture on a safari into the heart of a lush tropical rainforest where 275 dazzling waterfalls cascade and create nature's soundtrack. In Iguazu National Park, you'll find rare and endangered species of birds, more than 700 species of butterflies, vibrantly colored toucans, the giant river otter and the elusive jaguar. Your tour begins in an open air jeep – trek through the heart of the forest, and for those feeling a little more adventurous, follow one of the guides along some trails to the Salto Macuco waterfall, passing ancient trees and wild orchids on the way! Then it's time for your exhilarating trip on motorized inflatable boats. Mist from the thundering falls nurtures the lush flora surrounding you – including orchids, hearts of palm trees and bromeliads – and rainbows abound. Enjoy a refreshing "waterfall shower" as the captain maneuvers the boat to fully appreciate the scenery. Rio de Janeiro

Tijuca Forest National Park and Historic Santa Teresa

Venture into the lush Tijuca Forest National Park by open-jeep for a tour that truly showcases the spectacular rainforest around Rio de Janeiro. Tijuca is all that remains of the Mata Atlântica (Atlantic Forest) which once surrounded Rio. The 8,000-acre park, once stripped bare by sugar cane and coffee plantations, was replanted in 1861 and features stunning waterfalls, high peaks and verdant forest surrounding Corcovado Mountain and the Christ the Redeemer statue. Go in search of the forest's extraordinary wildlife and take in the natural beauty that surrounds you. Pause at the Vista Chinesa overlook pagoda where you'll be rewarded with inspiring views of Ipanema and Copacabana beaches, Guanabara Bay and Sugar Loaf. Stop at one of the park's many entrances and take a short walk on level ground to experience this jungle up close. Then you'll delve deeper into Rio's fascinating history, thriving legacy and blend of colonial classical and Brazilian Imperial elegance. Set off for a tour of the charming Santa Teresa neighborhood, often compared to Paris' historic Montmartre. Arrive via the historic Santa Teresa tramway, the last one still in use in Rio, taking in captivating views of the city below as it travels across the landmark Lapa Arches aqueduct. Santa Teresa's traditional district features beautiful estate homes from the beginning of the century, built mainly by English railroad managers. It's now experiencing a revitalization as an artistic and bohemian center. *Duration: Approximately 4 hours.* Please note a minimum of 2 passengers is required. Transportation is included.

Roll up your sleeves for an authentic Brazilian culinary experience! Get to know the secrets of Brazilian cuisine that blends culinary traditions from around the globe. Set off to a local market where you'll meet your chef and shop for groceries for today's cooking event. Learn about shopping in Rio, and the main staples found in any Carioca kitchen. Then it's time to get into the kitchen! Start off your class with a welcome drink as you enjoy an introductory presentation about Brazilian culinary history. Learn the importance and nutritional value of manioc, or cassava, a staple food of the indigenous culture. Following a delicious tasting of "aipim frito," fried manioc, learn how to make a scrumptious "batida de côco" with coconut. For the entrée, perhaps you'll prepare an authentic Brazilian "feijoada" – a mouthwatering black bean stew from Portuguese tradition – or "Moqueca" – a delectable seafood coconut stew featuring the bounty of the sea. Learn how to choose the freshest ingredients and your chef's culinary techniques to practice at home. Your dessert will be a special surprise, but one you won't want to miss. The Rio de Janeiro Olympic Park and Botanical Gardens

Your experience begins by rediscovering the magic of the 2016 Olympic Games in Rio de Janiero. Take a walk through the main Olympic Park in Barra, and marvel at the stadiums that hosted some of the world's best athletes. Get exclusive entrance into some of these stadiums. Then, savor some free time for lunch along the shore in an area that is a mainstay for many surfers in the region before heading to the historic Rio Botanical Gardens. Founded by King John VI of Portugal in 1808, it was originally intended to grow spices such as tea, nutmeg, cloves and cinnamon, as an alternative to the long trip to Asia to get them. This expansive garden is about 140 hectares and has vegetation similar to the Atlantic Forest. With 7,200 species of plants including roughly 5,500 trees and shrubs, it is considered one of the most important botanical gardens in the world. The 1930s-era English style greenhouse houses a portion of the impressive Orchidarium with over 3,000 orchids. You will then return to the hotel to gather your belongings before transferring to the airport. Note: This optional tour is only available for guests with later departure flight.
